At the Longs Peak Council, our mission is:


“To develop character, integrity, and leadership in youth through quality programs, outdoor experiences, and service to community.”

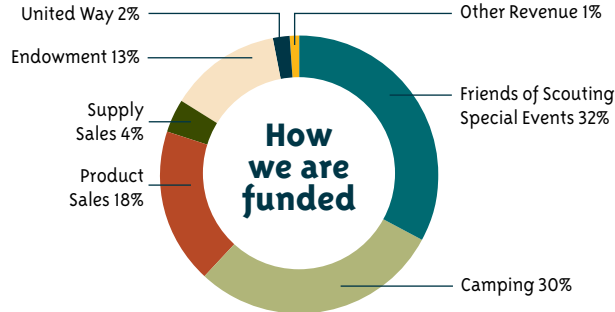

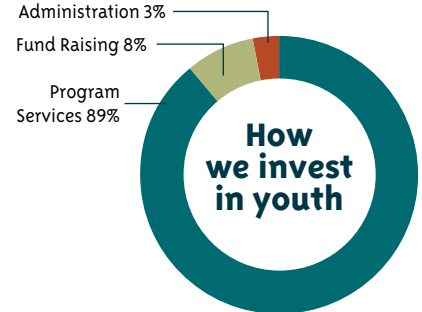
